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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report presents the comprehensive findings and statistical overview of Madan Bhandari Memorial College for the academic year 2081/082 B.S. (2024/025 A.D.), prepared under the Education Management Information System (EMIS) framework. The purpose of this document is to provide accurate data and insights to support institutional planning, policy formation, and decision-making for improving the quality and accessibility of higher education in Nepal.

During the reporting year, the college recorded a total of 996 students enrolled across both Bachelor and Master levels. Of the total, 918 students were enrolled in Bachelor programs, while 78 were enrolled in Master's programs. Gender-wise, the overall Gender Parity Index (GPI) stands at 0.78, with 558 male and 438 female students. The GPI at the Bachelor level is 0.76, and at the Master level is 1.23, indicating a relatively higher female participation in postgraduate education compared to undergraduate levels. Ethnically, the student population is predominantly composed of individuals from the 'Others' category, with noticeable representation from Dalit, Madhesi, and Chhetri communities.

Enrollment by faculty shows that Humanities and Social Sciences lead with 420 students, followed by Management with 347, and Science & Technology with 229. At the provincial level, Bagmati Province contributes the highest number of students (386), followed by Koshi (209), Lumbini (103), and Sudurpashchim (94). District-wise, Kathmandu records the highest student enrollment with 121 students. This data indicates the institution's strong regional presence, especially in central Nepal, while also attracting students from multiple provinces. In terms of student performance, 97 students appeared in the final examinations, out of which 86 successfully passed, resulting in an impressive overall pass rate of approximately 89%. The BA and BBS programs had students appear for the examinations, while other programs either did not have final-year candidates or did not conduct examinations during this reporting period. Student dropout data remains low, with only 4 students reported as having dropped out, all from the BA program. These dropouts include individuals from the Dalit and Madhesi communities, suggesting the need for further interventions in student retention and academic support targeting marginalized groups.

The college employs a total of 92 teaching staff members across all departments. Teaching staff distribution by qualification shows that the majority hold Master's degrees (75), followed by MPhil (12), and PhD (4). Faculty representation is highest in the School of Management (34 teachers), followed by the School of Science & Technology (29) and the School of Liberal Arts

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(29). The institution also maintains a staff diversity profile based on ethnicity and gender, reflecting its commitment to inclusive employment practices.

On the administrative side, there are 33 non-teaching staff members serving in various capacities including assistants, drivers, accountants, and support personnel. The Student-Teacher Ratio (STR) for the college overall is 29.29, with the Management faculty demonstrating the most optimal ratio of 11.19.

In conclusion, this report demonstrates that Madan Bhandari Memorial College is progressing steadily in terms of enrollment, academic delivery, and institutional development. It highlights areas of strength and identifies opportunities for strategic improvement, particularly in enhancing gender balance and supporting underrepresented communities in both enrollment and staff composition. The data contained herein serves as a vital tool for stakeholders to ensure informed planning and continual quality enhancement in higher education.

For postgraduate studies, the college runs Master's programs in English (MA English), Journalism and Mass Communication (MA JMC), and Sociology (MA Sociology). 3. Student Enrolment


As per the Education Management Information System (EMIS) Report of Higher Education for the academic year 2081/082 B.S. (2024/025 A.D.), Madan Bhandari Memorial College has a total student enrolment of 996. At the bachelor's level, there are 918 students enrolled, comprising 523 male and 395 female students. At the master's level, the enrolment includes 35 male and 43 female students, totaling 78. This data highlights the college's commitment to inclusive education and its continued efforts to provide quality higher education to a diverse student population.

3.1. Student Enrollment/Registration Detail

In the academic year 2081/082 B.S. (2024/025 A.D.), Madan Bhandari Memorial College successfully installed and operated the fully functional HEMIS (Higher Education Management Information System) web-based software. This system has been effectively utilized for student enrolment, making the admission process more efficient, transparent, and data-driven. A total of 996 students were enrolled through this system, including 918 at the bachelor's level (523 male and 395 female) and 78 at the master's level (35 male and 43 female). The implementation of HEMIS reflects the college's commitment to adopting digital tools for better academic management. 3.2. Total number of students by faculty, level, program, and gender

As per the Education Management Information System (EMIS) Report of Higher Education for the academic year 2081/082 B.S. (2024/025 A.D.), Madan Bhandari Memorial College has recorded a detailed breakdown of student enrolment by faculty, level, program, and gender. At the bachelor's level, the Humanities and Social Sciences faculty includes 191 students in the BA program (78 male and 113 female) and 151 students in the BCA program (119 male and 32 female). The Management faculty comprises 96 students in the BBM program (38 male and 58 female) and 251 students in the BBS program (133 male and 118 female). The Science and Technology faculty has 229 students enrolled in the BScCSIT program (155 male and 74 female). At the master's level under the Humanities and Social Sciences faculty, 78 students (35 male and 43 female) are enrolled in various MA programs. Altogether, the college maintains a strong enrolment across disciplines, totaling 996 students, with no representation in the "Other" gender category for this academic year.

3.3. Total students by faculty, level, program, and ethnicity

In the academic year 2081/082 B.S. (2024/025 A.D.), Madan Bhandari Memorial College recorded a total student enrolment of 996, categorized by ethnicity across various programs and faculties. Out of the total, 903 students belong to the "Others" category, followed by 55 Madhesi and 38 Dalit students. There were no recorded students from the Muslim, Tharu, Janajati, or Chhetri communities in this academic year. This data reflects the ethnic diversity among the student population and supports inclusive access to higher education.

3.4. Total number of students by program and gender

In the academic year 2081/082 B.S. (2024/025 A.D.), Madan Bhandari Memorial College enrolled students across six academic programs with a total of 996 students. Among them, the BBS program had the highest number of students (251), followed by BSc CSIT (229) and BCA (151). Gender-wise, male students (558) slightly outnumbered female students (438) across all programs. The data reflects balanced gender participation in most programs, with notable female representation in BA, BBM, BBS, and MA.

3.5. Total students by program, ethnicity, and gender

In the academic year 2081/082 B.S. (2024/025 A.D.), Madan Bhandari Memorial College enrolled a total of 996 students across various academic programs, comprising 558 male and 438 female students. The Gender Parity Index (GPI) indicates significant variation across programs, with the highest female representation in BBM (1.53) and BA (1.45), while BCA recorded the lowest GPI at 0.27. These figures highlight both gender diversity and the need for improved gender balance in certain technical programs.

Regarding ethnicity, the majority of students (903) were categorized under "Others," with additional representation from 55 Madhesi and 38 Dalit students. Notably, there were no students recorded from the Brahman, Muslim, Tharu, Janajati, or Chhetri categories for this academic year. This demographic distribution provides insight into the college's enrolment trends and the broader social inclusion landscape within higher education.

3.6. Number of students by faculty and gender

In the academic year 2081/082 B.S. (2024/025 A.D.), Madan Bhandari Memorial College had a total of 996 students enrolled across three faculties. The Faculty of Humanities had the highest enrolment with 420 students (232 male and 188 female), followed by the Management faculty with 347 students (171 male and 176 female). The Faculty of Science and Technology enrolled 229 students, consisting of 155 male and 74 female students. This distribution highlights a relatively balanced gender representation in the Management faculty and strong male participation in Science and Technology programs.




Figure 3: Total number of students by faculty

3.7. Students by level and Gender




Figure 4: Total number of students by level and gender

3.9. Students by province, ethnicity, and gender

In the academic year 2081/082 B.S. (2024/025 A.D.), Madan Bhandari Memorial College enrolled a total of 994 students from all seven provinces of Nepal. The highest number of students, 386, came from Bagmati Province, followed by 209 from Koshi and 119 from Madhesh. Programs such as BScCSIT and BBS attracted students from across all provinces, reflecting the college's academic reach and reputation. This province-wise distribution highlights the institution's role as a center for inclusive and nationwide higher education.

6. ender Parity Index

The **Gender Parity Index** (**GPI**) is a statistical measure used to assess the relative access and participation of males and females in a particular educational context. Typically, it is expressed as a ratio:

The Formula for GPI is as below:

GPI = Number of females enrolled or attaining a certain level/Number of males enrolled or attaining that same level

A GPI value close to **1.0** indicates parity between genders, whereas values below or above 1.0 suggest disparities:

GPI helps in understanding whether policies are successfully addressing gender imbalances. Data-driven insights from GPI can guide targeted interventions, such as scholarships, support programs, and outreach efforts. Educational authorities use GPI to monitor progress towards gender equality goals and to set benchmarks for improvements.

The GPI index by program, level, and faculty is shown in the table below.

6.1. Overall GPI in Enrollment Record

In the academic year 2081/082 B.S. (2024/025 A.D.), Madan Bhandari Memorial College recorded a total enrolment of 996 students, with 558 male and 438 female students. The overall Gender Parity Index (GPI) stood at 0.78, indicating a higher proportion of male students across all levels. At the bachelor's level, the GPI was 0.76, showing male dominance in enrolment, while at the master's level, the GPI was 1.23, reflecting a higher female participation in postgraduate studies. These figures highlight a gender imbalance at the undergraduate level and a more inclusive trend at the postgraduate level.

7. Teaching and Non-Teaching Staff

In the academic year 2081/082 B.S. (2024/025 A.D.), Madan Bhandari Memorial College employed a total of 125 staff members across various departments. This included 92 teaching staff actively engaged in delivering academic programs in all faculties. Additionally, 33 non-teaching staff members supported administrative, technical, and operational functions essential to the smooth running of the college. This balanced staffing structure reflects the institution's commitment to both quality education and efficient institutional management.



7.1. Teaching Staff

All the teaching staffs detail of our campus is presented in the table below. The teaching members' details are summarized by the post, joining type, and gender.

7.1.1. Total number of teachers by ethnicity and gender

In the academic year 2081/082 B.S. (2024/025 A.D.), Madan Bhandari Memorial College employed a diverse group of teaching staff, categorized by ethnicity and gender. The total number of teachers across all employment types (permanent, temporary, contract, and part-time) was 96, with 59 staff members belonging to the "Others" ethnic group, including 33 male and 5 female teachers. Other ethnic groups such as Brahman, Chhetri, Janajati, Madhesi, Muslim, and Tharu had fewer staff members, with Brahman and Others being the most represented in the college's teaching workforce.

In terms of gender distribution, the majority of teaching staff were male, with 68 male teachers, 27 female teachers, and 1 teacher listed under the "Other" gender category. The highest number of female teachers was found in the "Others" ethnic group, with 5 female teachers, while other ethnicities had very few female representations. This diverse staffing composition reflects the college's commitment to maintaining an inclusive and equitable educational environment, though there is a notable gender imbalance in certain ethnic groups.

7.1.2. Teaching staff according to their qualification

In the academic year 2081/082 B.S. (2024/025 A.D.), Madan Bhandari Memorial College employed a total of 92 teaching staff, categorized by their highest academic qualification. Of these, 4 teachers held a PhD, 12 had an MPhil, and 75 were qualified with a Master's degree. Additionally, there was 1 teaching staff member with a Bachelor's degree. The majority of the faculty were Master's degree holders, with a notable gender disparity, as 65 male teachers and only 9 female teachers held this qualification. 7.1.3. Summary of the teachers by their teaching faculty in the collage

In the academic year 2081/082 B.S. (2024/025 A.D.), Madan Bhandari Memorial College had a total of 34 teachers across various faculties, with a total student population of 996. In the Management faculty, 31 teachers (26 male and 5 female) were responsible for 347 students, yielding a student-to-teacher ratio (STR) of 11.19. The Science and Technology faculty had only 1 teacher for 229 students, resulting in a very high STR of 229. The Humanities & Social Science faculty, despite having a large student body of 420, had no teaching staff recorded, and the Education faculty had 2 teachers. The overall STR for the entire college was calculated at 29.29, reflecting varying teaching workloads across the different faculties.

8.1. Student-Teacher Ratios on Campus

At Madan Bhandari Memorial College in the academic year 2081/082 B.S. (2024/025 A.D.), the overall student-teacher ratio (STR) stands at 29.29, based on a total of 996 students and 34 teaching faculty. The Management faculty exhibits a balanced ratio of 11.19 students per teacher with 31 teachers for 347 students. The Science and Technology faculty, however, shows a significantly high STR of 229.00 due to only one teacher for 229 students.

9. Student Enrollment Trends

The line graph illustrates the student enrollment trend at Madan Bhandari Memorial College over five fiscal years (2077/078 to 2081/082 B.S.). The total number of students gradually declined from 200 in 2077/078 to 159 in 2080/081, before sharply increasing to 291 in 2081/082. Male enrollment followed a similar pattern, decreasing from 113 to 85, then rising significantly to 167. Female enrollment, which was initially lower than male enrollment, also dropped from 87 in 2077/078 to 74 in 2080/081, and then increased to 124 in 2081/082.

This recent surge in both male and female enrollments in 2081/082 marks a positive recovery and growth in overall student numbers after a period of decline. The data indicates a renewed interest or improved outreach and academic offerings that attracted more students, particularly a notable increase in female participation in the most recent fiscal year.





Figure 5: Student Enrollment Trends since 2077/078- 2081/082
